
TIC Staff are now in a common area with comfortable amenities that facilitate communication and workflow.



The [O.J. Noer Memorial Collection](#) continues to grow steadily, built both by donations and purchases.

The oldest acquisition for 2007, J.A. Gibbs' *The Improvement of Cricket Grounds on Economic Principles*, from 1895, is very rare, and apparently was the first published work ever written on cricket pitch construction and maintenance.
